



On Saturday, July 31, 2010, Bishop Robert W. Finn, D.D., of the Diocese of Kansas City - St. Joseph, Missouri, received the perpetual vows of Sister Maria Stella of the Merciful Heart of Jesus, C.J.D., and the first vows of Sister Maria Damiana Lee, C.J.D., at a 10 AM Mass at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, Raytown, Missouri. On the same day, Bishop Finn granted Sisters in Jesus the Lord status as a Public Association of the Faithful. Our community began as a Private Association in 2003, and was elevated to a Private Association of the Faithful by Bishop Finn on June 19, 2009. The next step, after more time and further progress, is Diocesan Institute, God willing!

Sister Maria Stella Whittier, C.J.D., made her first private vows in 2005, and has been with our community

since 2003. Sister Maria Damiana Lee, C.J.D., became a novice in 2008, and has been with us since 2007. In preparation for these vows, Sister Maria Stella made a month-long retreat, and Sister Maria Damiana made a retreat of seven days.

We are grateful that so many of you were able to be with us on our memorable day. Father Daniel Maurer, C.J.D., of our brother community in Vladivostok, the Canons Regular of Jesus the Lord, extended his promotion time in the United States in order to be with us. Father Myron Effing, C.J.D., sent his blessings.

The families of the two sisters making vows were well-represented. Seminarians from the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph, Missouri, served at the altar along with servers from our parish.

The parishioners, joined by some friends, put on a beautiful reception for us in the school gym. Thank you to all who helped make this day so special through your loving generosity!+

REFLECTIONS FROM A MOTHER

Seeing our daughter so radiantly happy on her day of profession of perpetual vows was truly one of the happiest days of my life. Like most mothers, when she was little I imagined her getting married one day to the man of her dreams and raising a family, rarely thinking about a religious vocation for her. At age 19, however, she surprised me by expressing a desire to enter religious life after working during spring break as a student

volunteer in a homeless shelter. For the next 8 years my husband and I observed the thoughtful choices she made as far as schooling and work and watched our daughter's vocation develop into a solid commitment to co-found a new order of missionaries to Russia. It was still very difficult to say good-bye when she left for Minnesota from Virginia on this new adventure, but we knew that her decision had been prayerfully made and were

confident that God would show her if this was indeed His will for her.

When my husband and I saw our daughter's face as she spoke clearly the words of commitment to a life of obedience, chastity, and poverty, we knew that she could not have chosen a better life for herself. We also knew that God had chosen a gem, a grace-filled soul with many talents to offer as a religious sister. Her concert the following day which she called "In Jubilatio" in thanksgiving for the gift of religious life, expressed to the fullest her total joy at having been espoused to Jesus forever. She was a most beautiful bride of Christ playing first the organ, then the harp, as well as chanting and singing. My husband and I just held hands and listened, feeling humbled and honored to be her parents. It has been an awesome experience to be Sr. Maria Stella's mother and I hope that parents of children considering vocations will realize the wonderful blessing it is to have God choose a child from your family.+

ST. THERESE OF LISIEUX: PROTECTRESS OF CATHOLICS IN RUSSIA



St. Thérèse of Lisieux was named protectress of Catholics in Russia by Pope Pius XI in 1932. From February 27 to June 30, 1999, her relics went all across the Russian Federation. Her relics were venerated for four days in Vladivostok by many Catholics and Orthodox. Hymns in her honor were translated into Russian, and *The Story of A Soul* was published in Russian.
